

When I was an undergraduate student, before the path of surgery, I studied geology. This was perfect for me because all I wanted to do was to be outside, have an excuse to wear overalls, and shave as little as possible. One of our intro courses in field geology was taught by a professor at the end of his career, a grandfather, a past chairman who was teaching this most basic intro course just because he wanted to, because he loved to. At the beginning of each class he would read a passage from a story, a poem, an essay. He would read words of others that meant something to him, that embodied in some completely different way exactly the beauty and points he wanted to get across in that day's lecture, or sometimes a moment of wisdom he wanted to get across to a room full of kids. One morning he started with a quote from the Native American author Sherman Alexie, "The Earth is our grandmother and that technology has become our mother and that they both hate each other." As he read the quote, barely looking at the page, you could see the glimmer in his eye of a fight, a belief, a cause much larger than him or anyone else. Much bigger than politics, borders, or despair. As I look back decades ago to this class, these quotes, poems, words of experience &

Was I there?





This is the story of a mind that has been borrowed deep enough to feel so sick at a violent, soft, plenty rhythm.


Nothing else made her to feel so vulnerable...


